

Massachusetts Vital Records. 1902 Marriages. Vol. 527, p. 88, No. 2008

Frederick O.G. Lyon of 153 M St., Boston, 24 salesman, born Boston, 1st marriage, and Annie L. McKinnon of 153 M St., Boston, 23, at home, born Charlottetown, P.E.I., 1 st marriage, married in Boston May 19, 1902 by James Huxtable of 568 E. Fifth St., Boston, Minister of the Gospel. Groom's parents: Joseph Lyon and Hattie S. Parmenter. Bride's parents: John McKinnon and *Sarah Rogers.
Reported from Boston.

**P.S. - Annie's sister, Minnie was married to a Rogerson, and Annie had stayed with them before she moved to USA, I can see how someone, perhaps her new husband, might have thought that "Rogers" was her mother's maiden name... Should be "Buchanan"...*

Lester Hazen Lyon born 153 M St., Boston, July 12, 1902. Parents: Fred G. Lyon of Boston, clerk , born Boston, and Annie L. McKinnon of Boston, born P.E.I.

In the 1900 census, Fred O.G. Lyon, 22, single, born Mass. In March 1878, a shipper, was a patient in Boston City Hospital at the time of the census.

In the 1910 census, Frederick G Lyon, Annie L., and Lester were at 675 East 6th St., Boston.

In the 1920 census, Frederick O. Lyon, Annie and Lester H. were at 1596 Columbia Road, Boston.

In the 1930 census, Annie L., widow, age 50 and Lester H, age 27 , single, were still at 1596 Columbia Road, Boston. He is called a commercial traveler, selling building stone, so evidently he was a salesman like his father. It begins to look like Lester might have remained single, but just a guess.

The Social Security Death Index says that Lester died in January 1950, but that's all. It doesn't say where.
